during their six-month absence. Currently, they are well. Most of the teens have even showed their increasing maturity by taking responsibility for certain day-to-day operational tasks, such as washing buses. One of the main blessings prior to the Grahams' departure was the addition of solar power, which allows the village to avoid the country's massive rotating power outages. This major crisis will only get worse as the country's power grid continues to be unreliable and may collapse.

Though other good charities exist, we like to think that ours is one of the



most rewarding because donations go directly to benefit our Children's Village. We have no paid staff; our directors are volunteers and receive no financial benefits; and my wife and I receive funding from our supporting churches via a missions' clearinghouse in Missouri.

Union address, the \$7 billion-a-year program is up for reauthorization in Congress. Despite past bipartisan support, PEPFAR has been flat-funded for years and could fall victim to partisan fights and shifting public health priorities. This five-year renewal partly hinges on whether there are any basic changes to the program, or whether lawmakers opt for a new program. (see "PEPFAR" p.2)

"Too many times, I think we start patting ourselves on the back before we're done," said Deborah Birx, former White House coronavirus response coordinator, drawing a parallel to the U.S. COVID-19 response. "We still have a long way to go." PEPFAR, which was architected in part by former NIAID director Anthony Fauci, was started at a time when communities in Africa were being devastated by HIV/AIDS, said Birx, who led PEPFAR from 2014 - 2020. When Bush announced PEPFAR, Congress allocated \$15 million in spending over

five years, Brix and her colleagues were stunned. "I couldn't believe it," said Blrx. "This was not business as usual. This was about doing things differently and consistently," she continued. Congress has since allocated more than \$100 billion globally for access to tools like antiretroviral medications, preventive prophylaxis drugs, HIV counseling and testing, voluntary male circumcision, and health care worker training. An estimated 25 million lives have been saved and more than 5.5 million babies have been born HIVfree as a result. To continue reading click **PEPFAR**.

# **Operating Budget**



As a nongovernment entity, the Children's Resiliency Project receives most of its funding from businesses, churches and individuals to operate its children's villages in South Africa. To keep operating efficiently during the year, charity must generate at least \$9091 per month to reach its current

The South African Children's Project offers exciting ways to earn a trip to Indawo Yethemba Children's Village in South Africa while raising funds for the project. If you are a marathon runner or a long-distance cyclist, you can earn a round-trip ticket to visit the Graham family and the grannies and children

at their children's village in Ashburton. If you are a runner, the Comrades Ultra Marathon takes place annually in June. It is an 89-kilometer (56-miles) race from Durban to Pietermaritzburg. The race route includes our children's village. It has been several years since we hosting a runner and would love to host other runners soon. Visit www.comrades.com for more information. If you are a cyclist, the Amashova Durban Classic takes place in October. It is a 106-kilometer (66 miles) race from Pietermaritzburg to Durban. Basically, the CRP's board of directors has agreed to reimburse a round-trip economy ticket for each \$5,000 raised for its children's projects in South Africa. Participants are encouraged to plan at least nine days for their trip, which usually includes five to six days at CRP's Indawo Yethemba Children's, located in
